

AT A MEETING OF THE MIDDLESEX COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS  
HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 18, 2008, IN THE BOARD ROOM OF THE

**CALL TO ORDER**

The Chairman Mr. Williams called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M. Mr. Crittenden offered a prayer and Mr. Culley led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**REZONING APPLICATION #2008-006, STEVEN J. BLAND**

Planning Director, Matt Walker, presented the Board with additional information, including a revised petition of support submitted by the applicant and a petition and letter of opposition received earlier in the day. Mr. Walker showed the aerial view of the property with the proposed subdivision layout, noting that the parcel was in two sections connected by a 12 foot easement, but had one map number. Several members expressed concern that the back section section, designated as part of proposed open space, is not really a part of the main development and asked if it could be used for anything else. Mr. Walker noted that the easement is not large enough for road access.

Mr. Miller stated that he wanted time to review the new petitions and to talk with some of the people that had signed them. Mr. Jessie noted that only 9 of the 39 people signing the favorable petition lived in the area. Mr. Crittenden expressed is concern that a majority of those that signed the petition in favor did not live in the area and that supervisors from the district needed to be comfortable before action was taken. The motion to table action on the application for 30 days, to allow review of the petitions, was made by Mr. Crump, seconded by Mr. Miller and carried unanimously.

Mr. Soberick noted that the Board of Supervisors needed to come up with a rule for how long information can be accepted on an application. He added that it is unfair to the applicant to accept petitions after the public hearing comment period.

**PAYROLL**

The motion to approve payroll for the month of November was made by Mr. Miller, seconded by Mr. Jessie and carried unanimously. Checks numbered 63273 through 63348 totaling \$340,654.06 were distributed as approved.

**DISBURSEMENTS**

The motion to approve the disbursements was made by Mr. Miller, seconded by Mr. Crump and carried unanimously. Checks numbered 63351 through 63423 totaling \$485,116.02 were disbursed as approved.

**ADJOURNED**

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned until the next regular meeting scheduled for December 2, 2008, 9:00 a.m., on a motion by Mr. Crump, second by Mr. Miller and carried unanimously.
