CALL TO ORDER

Mr. Crump called the meeting to order.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

Matt Walker, Planning Director, explained the background of the Comprehensive Plan update and introduced Mr. Terry Harrington, Consultant for the Plan. Mr. Harrington gave a presentation of the proposed Comprehensive Plan. Mr. Harrington noted that the committee chose to project a higher growth rate over the next few years over what the Weldon Cooper Center projected. Mr. Walker presented the major differences between the 2001 and 2009 Comprehensive Plans. The number one priority is still to preserve the rural character of the County.

The Board of Supervisors and Planning Commissioners continued discussion related to the Draft of the Comprehensive Plan and land use on the Route 33/17 corridor. The Planning Commission has restricted the Locust Hill area and Jamaica area across from the race track from future growth.

There was a consensus that the Comprehensive Plan would go to Public Hearing at the Planning Commission's regular June 11, 2009 meeting.
